Please be seated before the prompt 7pm start.

The first two nights will cover:

- Stayman and transfers over 1NT opener (April 3rd)
- Doubles takeout, penalty, balancing a really important topic many juniors would benefit from this (April 10th)

Later this year we may do a course for advanced improvers – Bergen raises, cue bidding, checkback stayman etc. Watch this space!

Our lessons have significantly boosted our membership numbers over the last 2 years. 12 of the 2023 cohort taught by John Fergusson are still playing at the club and a further 14 from the 2024 lessons taught by Maureen Nelson are still playing.

Out and About in Franklin

Have you wondered over recent months (and months) what's going on at Roulston Park, on the corner of East Street opposite Hell Pizza? It's all been part of a big upgrade by the Auckland Council, Franklin Local Board, as part of the wider town centre improvements. The upgraded park will feature trampolines, climbing towers, slides, a barrier along the busy roadside, a BBQ and places to sit and paths to walk.

The implementation of the traffic lights at Bombay motorway intersection has caused big tailbacks, both along East Street onramp and at the motorway exit. Auckland Transport say it'll "take a few weeks for the algorithms to be established for the phasing".
