Discussion followed, agreeing that although Monday nights will be unchanged, we can and must change some of our Wednesday night schedules/behaviours/ to draw in those who have just completed lessons and make them feel part of the club.

Matters Arising:

1. Increasing our annual Subscriptions

Maureen handed out a proposal to increase the sub for 2023 to \$123 p.a., being \$100 (including gst) for the club, plus the \$23 NZ Bridge levy.

It will have to be approved by members at either a Special General Meeting or at the AGM – query whether to combine this with the AGM. Suggested that we call an SGS, on a Wednesday night for 7pm.

Information from NZ Bridge re online strategy:

This strategy is due for implementation on 1 January 2023.

Discussion revolved around the survival of clubs as online bridge gains

strength. It was agreed by all that both online sessions and online tournaments would cause the disintegration of clubs and eventually NZ Bridge. We agreed that NZ Bridge must only support the masterpoint system of in person club play for the survival of NZ clubs.

We discussed how there are many ways to cheat in online bridge, and how the larger clubs may have the personnel and facilities to run online bridge, which becomes lucrative for them, considering the overhead costs of in-person play for both players and clubrooms. Some larger clubs have begun advertising for new members from other clubs, signalling the beginning of the disintegration of small clubs.

We agreed that for many people, our return to bridge after Covid lockdowns is about the social hub and competition of the clubroom and this is of utmost importance for the future.

Agreed that Caroline is to make a submission to NZ Bridge outlining all of the above, and circulate it by email to the committee for approval, before submitting by the deadline of 12 th August.

Treasurer's Report:

Our bank balance stands at \$37,000. We have paid the annual insurance premium of \$6040.
