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

Lesson One

Stayman Convention

Basic Rules for Opening 1NT

- •12 14 HCP
- Balanced Hand
 - No singleton or void
 - Only one doubleton
 - No 5-card major



This bid is your FIRST choice of opening bid

CURRENT Responses to 1NT

- WITH A BALANCED HAND
 - 0 10 HCP ... no GAME possible ... PASS
 - 11 12 HCP ... GAME is possible ... Bid 2NT
 - 13+ HCP ... definitely in GAME ... Bid 3NT

These are going to change



CURRENT Responses to 1NT

- WITH AN UNBALANCED HAND
 - 0 10 HCP ... no GAME possible ... Bid your longest suit at the lowest possible level
 - 13+ HCP ... Bid your 5-card suit at the 3-level
 - 13+ HCP ... Bid your 6-card major at the 4-level

ALL of these are going to change after both lessons tonight



WHAT IS WRONG WITH THIS?

- It is better to play in a major than it is to play in Notrumps
- It is difficult to make an invitational bid
- We can't ever find a 4 / 4 fit in a major

Therefore, we use the Stayman Convention

WHO INVENTED STAYMAN?

- Sam Stayman got all the credit because he wrote about it first
- It was actually invented by Sam's partner George Rapee
- Jack Marx also came up with
 the concept the same time as George



WHY USE STAYMAN?

To find a 4 − 4 fit in a major and escape playing
 in NT

The Stayman convention is a bid of 2* in response to a 1NT opener

WHEN TO USE STAYMAN?

- You hold at least one 4-card major
- And 11+ HCP
- Later tonight you'll learn what to do when you have a weak hand and a long suit


The Stayman convention is a bid of 2* in response to a 1NT opener

EXAMPLES ... Stayman or Not?

Partner opens 1NT

Your bid?

24



Enough HCP to consider game ... Check for a 4-4 spade fit first

EXAMPLES ... Stayman or Not?

Partner opens 1NT

Your bid?

2%



Enough HCP for game ...

Check for a 4-4 heart or spade fit first

EXAMPLES ... Stayman or Not?

Partner opens 1NT

Your bid?

PASS



Even though you have a 4-card major, your hand is too weak


HOW TO RESPOND TO STAYMAN 1NT – 2♣ - ?

- •2 ◆ I don't have a 4-card major
- 2 ♥ I have 4 hearts (I might have 4 spades)
- 2 I have 4 spades (I don't have 4 hearts)


2 says ... "Have you got a 4-card major?"

Opener MUST answer the question

EXAMPLES ... Responding to Stayman




EXAMPLES ... Responding to Stayman



WHAT HAPPENS NEXT? 1NT - 2♣ - 2 ♦ /2 ♥ /2♠ - ?

- Bid straight to game with a fit and game HCP
- Bid straight to 3NT with no fit in the major and game
 HCP
- Invite in a major (with a fit)
- Invite in 2NT (with no fit)
- Correct to 2♠ if your partner has denied ♥ and you have 4 spades





Note ... East must have 4 spades

EXAMPLES ... Full bidding (4) 1NT 2% 2 ¥ 3NT

Convert to spades

STAYMAN CAN ALSO BE USED FOR STRONG HANDS

Use after a 1NT overcall

Invitational hands are now 8+ HCP

Use over 2NT openings

•The bid is 3 ♣
